History Book Report

Many people have put a lot of time into this project in the last three months, but there's still a lot of work ahead. The 32 pages of family plot maps have been typed and are now being verified plot by plot at the cemetery. Indexing has begun on the 60+ pages of Strangers Rest maps, to which we keep adding new "finds". The list of Veterans has been completely retyped in an expanded database format (see Clements' Corner) and is also being field-verified.

Your response to our request for family information has been great. The only problem is that we have received about one-third of the stories we hope to have eventually, but three times what the compilers have been able to assimilate so far. We want to thank everyone who submitted information right away and apologize to those of you who haven't heard a response yet. We'll get there; but it takes a remarkable amount of "spare time" to get all the details just right. It is clear that the editing and reviewing process will continue for several months.

We now have biographies of about 350 people who were not included in the 1988 Washington Cemetery Centennial Book. If you haven't yet sent in your family history yet, it's not too late. As you gather with family over the holidays, try to take a few minutes to remember those who are no longer with us, drag out the photo albums, and jot down some of the reminiscences. We would like to have at least a rough draft for each plot by the end of the year. Details can be added during the editing process.

Washington Cemetery is the final resting place of immigrants from over a dozen nations, American veterans of nine wars and some who were in other armies before coming to this country, a ninth-generation Texan, survivors of the 1900 Storm and other memorable events ... the list goes on and on. Will the special folks in *your* family be included?

Phase 5 Monument Repairs Underway

The Monument Company and Robbins Monument Company have just completed repair and cleaning of 29 more headstones and 3 cradles in Phases 5A and 5B, at total cost of \$4,230. *In Section A:* W. A. Joseph La Rose O'Rillion (1914-1974), Josephine Mueller (1858-1942), Marguerite Bisbee (ca.1847-1890), Lou Lawler (1875-1897), Joseph Mitchell (1872-1919).

The Dunkerly and Smith cradles (C-130) were completely buried, and the Meek cradle (G-21) was in several pieces. Please stop by the cemetery and see the difference your donations are making. Contracts are being prepared for the next group of about 30.

Clements' Corner

Veterans of Washington Cemetery

Trustee **Gus Mistrot** has been hard at work verifying the military service of the veterans buried in Washington Cemetery, combining information from the families, headstone inscriptions, obituaries, and service and pension records to create an expanded and improved list of veterans for our new history book. At last count, he has identified 250 veterans, including 85 Confederate soldiers, 18 Union soldiers, two who were at the Battle of San Jacinto, and eight who were killed in action in World War I.

These numbers will almost certainly change as we continue to receive information from the families and research various historical sources. If you have not yet submitted your family information, please do so now. *It is not too late!*

An example of the veterans list envisioned for the new history book is shown below. This format is easier to read than the old one, and gives much more information. The source codes are a valuable new addition. For example, Wallace O'Reilly was killed in action in France and reinterred here three years later. His information comes from (C)emetery records, the (F)amily [see Biography section of the book], his (H)eadstone, and (N)ewspaper articles. Information on George Pattillo comes from these additional sources; (D)eath certificate, (P)ension file, and two books or other compilations: (1) "Roster of Confederate Soldiers," and (3) "Texas in the Confederacy." Diego Padilla is buried in Strangers Rest; his grave is physically located in Plot H-175.

Gus is especially trying to confirm each veteran's rank and unit. The importance of paying attention to such details became really clear when he found that a list of Confederate veterans given to CCWCC about 20 years ago included a man born in 1863 and

Treasurer's Report

During the last fiscal year, we have received 320 donations from individuals, as well as matching contributions from corporations (Exxon and Chase Manhattan Bank). Additionally, we received \$6,000 in foundation grants.

As described in the May 1999 newsletter, CCWCC Inc. has merged into Glenwood Cemetery Inc. In accordance with the merger agreement, CCWCC's Endowment Fund of \$528,750 was transferred to Bank of America as Trustee of the Fund. All income from this Fund will be used for restoration, operation, and maintenance of Washington Cemetery. The rest of the money (\$90,524) was transferred to WCHT for historical and restoration projects.

At year end, WCHT's Gravesite Restoration Fund amounted to \$113,678. The Major Monument and Strangers Rest restoration projects are continuing and donations for these projects are still needed. We are also in need of donations for research related to the new cemetery history book.

To reduce costs, we have begun removing nonrespondents from our mailing list. If your mailing label reads "1999" or "2000", you are considered a current donor and will continue to receive this newsletter. If you haven't donated recently, we urge you to do so now so you can keep up with the news from W.C.

Special Event: Veterans Day Celebration

Veterans Day 1999 will be celebrated at Washington Cemetery with a special ceremony at 11:00 a.m. on **Saturday, November 13.** The ceremonies will honor American veterans of all wars, over 250 of whom are buried here, including several who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.

WCHT Historian **Gov Clements** will give the keynote speech, with particular emphasis on veterans of the Texas War of Independence, Mexican War, and the War Between the States.

Members of the Lt. Cmdr. Edward Lea Camp and Sarah Emma Seelye Auxiliary of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and the Dick Dowling Camp of the Sons of Confederate Veterans will participate in a wreath-laying ceremony on the cemetery plots purchased by the two veterans' organizations, the United Confederate Veterans and the Grand Army of the Republic, in 1894.

The Palmer Guards unit of the Texas Brigade Reenactors will provide a uniformed color guard and honor guard, posting flags for the ceremony and firing a gun salute. And to top it all off, the Texian Volunteers unit of the Sons of the Republic of Texas will be there with their fully operable cannon, "Rolling Thunder".

As you can see, many people and groups have worked together to make this an event you won't want to miss. Let's show them how much we appreciate their efforts by joining with them to honor the fine men and women who served in our armed forces.
